ATTENDING PHYSICIAN INSTRUCTIONS TO PATIENTS RECEIVING
ALLERGY INJECTIONS

1. To minimize the risks of an allergic reaction or other adverse occurrences which may potentially result from the administration of allergy injections, the following safety precautions and procedures have been established. Please carefully read the information below and strictly follow the provisions outlined:
 - a. Complete and explicit instructions for administering your injection from the allergist are required prior to administration of your injection.
 - b. Provide the registered nurse with all information concerning any local or systemic reactions you have had from previous injections.
 - c. If you have missed two or more consecutive injections, the registered nurse is required to consult with your allergist before any additional injections can be given.
 - d. For your safety, there is a thirty (30) minute waiting requirement during which you must be observed, by the registered nurse, for any possible reactions. Please cooperate and follow this extremely important precaution. Hours of administration are: 9:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M.
2. For your general information, we have provided a list of the symptoms which may result from your allergy injections:
 - a. Itching of the hands, roof of the mouth, and nose; flushing of the face; sneezing; hives; asthma; weakness; nausea; vomiting; dizziness; fainting; serum sickness, anaphylactic shock, and death.
3. In the event a delayed reaction should occur, seek medical attention immediately!
4. I have read and do understand the above information and precautionary procedures. I agree to follow the safety procedures and requirements established by the Attending Physician.
